Talk Program on Post-Earthquake Disaster Governance in Nepal: Reflections from Practice





Context

Recurrent natural disasters pose formidable challenge to human society's survival and prosperity. Developing countries are particularly vulnerable to natural catastrophes. The devastating earthquakes that struck Nepal in 2015 are the latest in the history of disasters taking human lives and destroying the property.

With a highly differentiated society, disasters have particularly affected the poor, women and marginalized groups. The impact was severe because Nepal was ill-prepared for the calamity of such scale, and it struck the country at a time of drafting a new constitution following the decade long civil war. Reconstruction work is crawling with the delayed establishment of the National Reconstruction Authority (NRA) - the central body responsible for reconstruction of quake-destroyed houses and infrastructure.

In this context, Southasia Institute of Advanced Studies (SIAS) in collaboration with University of New South Wales (UNSW), Australia is going to organize a talk program on 10 May, 2016 entitled **Post-Earthquake Disaster Governance in Nepal: Reflections from Practice**. The talk program is anticipated to promote sharing among key Nepal recovery stakeholders to exchange ideas and provide strategic feedback for speedy and effective recovery efforts in Nepal. It will also provide an opportunity to pool conceptual innovations, practical insights, policy lessons, and enhance dialogue between policy makers and researchers.
